



IMPORTANT GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Students who arrive late for the Orientation Period may have to reapply for admission in the following year,
2. Every candidate for admission may be required, on arrival at the College, to sit an examination in English and in General Bible Knowledge before acceptance as a student is finalised.
3. Various tests may be given to determine the student's preparedness for higher education.
4. Where financial assistance has been granted, maintenance of grades is required for the continuance of that financial aid. (Refer to the Rules and Regulations)
5. The candidate will be required to sign an undertaking to give a number of hours per week for out-of-class study and a number of hours per week to work on the campus without remuneration to offset the cost of board and lodging.
6. Wives will, where possible, be expected to work to defray their family's expenses. They *must*, however, *attend all classes arranged for them*. No exceptions will be allowed.
7. Students who receive support from other parties **MUST** declare such support to the College. College support will be reduced or refused depending on a student's ability to provide for his own support. Failure to declare such external support may result in dismissal of the student.
8. Anyone may attend the College as a day-student provided he meets his own boarding and lodging needs. He may be required to pay certain fees as determined by the administration from time to time. He is expected to have a good moral standing in the community.
9. Candidates will be required to seek their own support from family, congregations or friends before applying for financial aid.
The income of wives will be considered before the granting of a bursary.
10. The College does not provide finance for the personal needs of students or the needs of a student's dependents.
11. Financial aid is only granted on the basis of genuine, documented need, to members of churches of Christ, *when available*. This must be applied for annually.
12. Where married students are supplied with housing (whether on a rental or rent-free basis), they are held personally responsible for the maintenance of a tidy appearance of the dwelling and property which they occupy. Note: No pets are allowed without permission.
 - a. A refundable maintenance deposit will be deducted monthly from a married student's bursary if he occupies College housing
 - b. The payment of municipal costs are the student's responsibility. Subject to availability of funding, the College may assist with these costs.
13. **NOTE: STUDENTS WHO SUBMIT FALSIFIED FORMS WILL BE DISMISSED.**
14. A student's home congregation, supporters or family may be supplied with grade/progress reports.
15. Since all assignments have to be typed, the candidate must ensure that he has access to a typewriter or computer etc. It is also advisable to take typing lessons.
16. **NOTE:** should the candidate fax the Application for Admission Form he will be required to mail the original to the College.
17. **ALL** first-year students are required to attend the Sunday morning and evening, and the Wednesday evening assemblies at Benoni church of Christ. Exemption is granted only for very exceptional circumstances.

18. Second and third-year students must request permission to attend other congregations **but only if** they have been asked to preach, teach, lead the singing or preside at the Lord's Table, etc. Otherwise, attendance at Benoni church of Christ is compulsory.
19. No first-year student may take courses from a college or university.
 - a. Permission for studying at a college or university from a student's second year will depend on the student's academic performance
 - b. Students whose academic performance at this College drops below standard due to external studies will lose his / her bursary. (Refer to the Rules and Regulations for the required GPA)
20. I understand that I may request a copy of the College's Rules for my perusal. I also understand that non-compliance with the College rules may result in immediate suspension or dismissal.
21. I understand and accept that the College dormitories close during the Easter, Winter and Summer breaks and that no student will be permitted to reside in the dormitories during these periods. It will be my responsibility, if I am a dorm student, to arrange alternative accommodation or return home during these periods, at my own cost.
22. I understand and accept that the College does not provide finance for study permits, medical assistance, relocation or any other personal need.
23. NOTE: *the college accepts no responsibility for injury or damage or theft incurred by the student.*
24. I hereby declare that I am not addicted to alcohol, nicotine or any other habit-forming drug. I understand that I will be dismissed instantly should I partake of alcohol, nicotine or any other habit-forming drug while a student at Southern Africa Bible College.
